Independent Advisory Groups

By joining your local Independent Advisory Group, you will work directly with the police, to help shape the way we work and the service we deliver. IAGs meet four times a year and people of all ages and backgrounds can get involved. REPORTING CRIME

By working together we can increase vigilance in the area to support the prevention, disruption and detection of crime. If you see or hear anything that appears unusual or suspicious, please let us know. To report a crime you can speak to one of our officers, visit any Thames Valley Police station, or call 101 (999 in an emergency). You can also report lower risk crimes, such as road traffic accidents and thefts from motor vehicles, on the Thames Valley Police website.

Thames Valley Alert

Please take the opportunity, if you are not already a member, to sign up to Thames Valley Alert. This messaging system provides free alerts via email, text, and even voice messages, about what's happening in the local area. The service is completely tailored to you, so you can choose what sort of alerts you would like to receive – whether you'd like updates on local incidents, community news, or you'd just like to be alerted to significant or high priority messages.
